| School | Published Admission Number | Allocation Detail – Statement for Appeal Purposes |
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| Aldryngton Primary | 45 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under oversubscription criteria A to E and 7 under criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.581 miles from the school according to the computerised mapping system used by the council's School Admissions Team. There were insufficient places for the remaining 37 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size. |
| All Saints CE (Aided) Primary | 45* | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. 5 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Places in the resource will be allocated by the Special Educational Needs Team. |
| Bearwood Primary | 45 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Beechwood Primary | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 5 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places |
| Colleton Primary, The | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| Coombes CE Primary, The | 75 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 5 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| Crazies Hill CE Primary | 15 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Earley St Peter's CE (Aided) Primary | 70 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. |
| Emmbrook Infant | 60 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to D plus 2 in criterion E. The last child allocated under criterion E lived 0.943 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 13 (3 in criterion E and 10 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Ewendons Primary | 54 | Ewendons Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Governing Body. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria A to C and 26 children in criterion E. The last child offered under criterion E lived 0.761 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 50 children (39 in criterion E, 1 in F and 10 in criterion G) and these children have been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from the parents that they wish their child to remain on the waiting list for the school. |

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| Farley Hill Primary | 30 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to D plus 1 in criterion E. The last child allocated under criterion E lived 1.29 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 16 children (2 in criterion E and 14 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Finchampstead CE Aided Primary | 17 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination |
| Floreat – Montague Park Primary | 60 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria i to iv and 44 children in criterion v. The last child offered under criterion v lived 1.281 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 12 children in criterion v who have been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from the parents that they wish their child to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice. |
| Gorse Ride Infant | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 3 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| Grazeley Parochial CE Aided Primary | 30 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria 1- 4 plus 14 in criterion 5. The last child offered under criterion 5 lived 0.99 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 18 children (15 in criterion 5, and 3 in criterion 6) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice. |
| Hatch Ride Primary | 30 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 4 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.208 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 10 children in criterion F (who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size. |
| Hawkedon Primary | 90 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Hawthorns Primary, The | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Highwood Primary | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 3 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| Hillside Primary | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 6 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |

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| Keep Hatch Primary | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 2 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| Lambs Lane Primary | 30* | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 18 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.326 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 13 children (4 in Criterion D, 1 in Criterion E and 8 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Loddon Primary | 90 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| Nine Mile Ride Primary | 50 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria A- E plus 22 in criterion F. The last child offered under criterion F lived 1.884 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 8 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. |
| Oaklands Infant | 60 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Piggott School (Charvil Piggott Primary School) | 30 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria 1- 5 plus 1 in criterion 6. The last child offered under criterion 6 lived 1.095 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 2 children in criterion 6 who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Polehampton CE Infant | 60 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 26 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.838 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 15 children (6 in Criterion D, 1 in Criterion E and 8 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Radstock Primary | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Rivermead Primary | 60 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 7 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.375 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 16 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Robert Piggott CE Infant | 45 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination |
| Shinfield Infant & Nursery | 90 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 14 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.059 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 23 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |

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| Sonning CE Aided Primary | 30 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. The Admissions Committee fully allocated the 30 places in accordance with the admissions policy where no higher preference could be offered. The last child allocated came from Category 8 living 1.003 miles from the school. There were insufficient places for the remaining 15 children in Category 8 who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice. |
| South Lake Primary | 60 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 31 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.462 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 29 children (2 in criterion E and 27 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| St Dominic Savio Catholic Primary | 60 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. After co-ordination, the last child allocated came from Category 7 living 0.677 miles from the school. There were insufficient places for the remaining 24 children in Category 7 who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice. |
| St Nicholas CE Primary | 20 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 4 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 2.352 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 1 child in criterion F who has been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| St Sebastian's CE Aided Primary | 26 | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| St Teresa's Catholic Primary | 45 | The Admissions Committee considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. |
| Walter Infant | 90 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Wescott Infant | 56* | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Wheatfield Primary | 30 | Wheatfield Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Academy Trust Board. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice. |
| Whiteknights Primary | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Willow Bank Infant | 60 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 20 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 3.754 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 2 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |

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| Windmill Primary | 30 | Windmill Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Academy Trust Board. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. |
| Winnersh Primary | 60 | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. |
| Woodley CE Primary | 45 | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under oversubscription criteria A to C and 29 under criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.372 miles from the school according to the computerised mapping system used by the council's School Admissions Team. There were insufficient places for the remaining 14 (4 in Criterion D, 5 in Criterion E and 5 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size. |

KEY TO HOW PLACES WERE ALLOCATED IN COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED SCHOOLS

The following oversubscription criteria, in order of priority, were applied when a community or voluntary controlled school received more preferences than places available:

- A 'Looked after' children or children who were 'looked after', but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order (previous 'looked-after' children)
- B Families who have exceptional medical or social needs as the grounds for their admission to a particular school
- C Children whose permanent home address is **inside** the schools' designated area and who has a sibling at the school at the time of application; who is expected to be attending the school when the child will enter the school.
- D Children whose permanent home address is in the school's designated area
- E Children whose permanent home address is **outside** the schools' designated area and who has a sibling at the school at the time of application; who is expected to be attending the school when the child will enter the school.
- F Any other children

For both community and voluntary controlled schools - all children with statements of special educational needs or an Education, Health and Care Plan that named a school in the statement or plan were admitted to the school that was named

If the school does not have sufficient places for children in any category, places will then be allocated on the basis of the radial distance using the local authority's computerised mapping system and the distance will be measured as a straight line between the Land and Property Gazetteer address points for the respective home address and school.
